

The Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany

was founded in 1951 as the international Jewish response to the West German government's promise to "make moral and material amends" to Jewish victims of the Holocaust.

The Claims Conference negotiates for a small measure of justice for Jewish victims of Nazi persecution. We establish and administer compensation funds; recover unclaimed Jewish property; fund vital social welfare services to aid elderly, vulnerable Holocaust victims; and support projects that preserve the memory and lessons of the Holocaust.

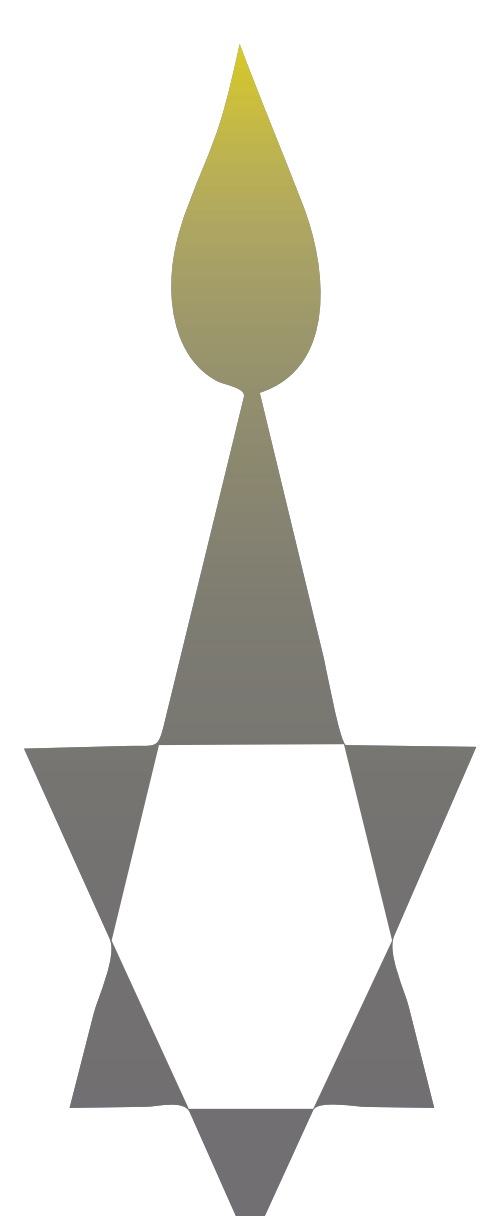
